












WATER OUALITY

Based on our North Fork Sediment Assessment, CUSP's crews continued hardening river access points to reduce erosion and sedimentation into the river. Unfortunately, it is human nature to take the easiest and shortest path. Along the river, this results in vegetation damage and degradation of the banks. By creating obvious paths with rock stairs, most users will use this

FOREST HEALTH

Forest Health and Wildfire Mitigation work completed in 2021:

RECREATION

We continued with our partnerships for maintenance -

- Denver Water for the Upper Gill Trail at Cheesman Reservoir area
- Aurora for the Trumbull Forests to Faucets site
- Great Outdoors Colorado, South Park National Heritage Area, and Colorado Parks and Wildlife supported the reconstruction of the Corral Cove Backcountry Trail at Eleven Mile State Park
- The team at Colorado Center for Outdoor Education/ Sanborn
 Western Camps supplied eager "volunteer campers" and funding for ongoing trail maintenance
- Installed 19 fire rings at US Forest Service dispersed camping sites in Buffalo Creek



FIRE RECOVERY

Sometimes things don't work out the way we planned, so we double back and try another method for the desired result.

Following the disappointing success of post-fire seeding at the Weston Pass Burn, CUSP's intrepid volunteers and staff spread 10,000 seed balls over areas that hadn't shown vegetation since the fire in 2018.

The seed balls are CUSP's native seed mix wrapped in soil, clay, and compost, then dried. The soil and compost give the seeds a head start to grow and discourage the wildlife from gobbling up the tender seeds and sprouts. Planting is as easy as spreading the balls in the spring. Then wait for moisture and warmer weather.

The project was successful! The photos show the result.





VOLUNTEERS

Our volunteers have a huge, positive impact on the watershed. Here's what volunteers accomplished in 2021:

- -246 acres were treated for noxious weeds with 390 volunteer hours
- -1,055 seedling trees were planted with 189 volunteer hours
- -683 volunteer hours on trail maintenance
- -464 volunteer hours on forest fuel mitigation
- -280 volunteer hours on water monitoring at the High Creek Fen
- -76 volunteer hours with the mushroom study







